SECOND MOTION TO CONTINUE PRELIMINARY HEARING

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE MARCOS E. LOPEZ UNITED STATES MAGISTRATE JUDGE FOR THE DISTRICT OF PUERTO RICO

COMES NOW the defendant, Jimmy Diaz-Rosa, hereinafter "Mr. Diaz," represented by the Federal Public Defender for the District of Puerto Rico and before this Honorable Court respectfully states as follows:

- Mr. Diaz is currently scheduled for a Preliminary Hearing on Thursday, March 19,
 2020. Docket No. 4. For the following reasons, he respectfully requests that this hearing be continued for one month.
- 2. Mr. Diaz was granted bail conditions on March 13, 2020. The same day, he was released from custody at MDC-Guaynabo to his mother, Ms. Carmen Rosa, who was qualified as third party custodian. Since then, Mr. Diaz has been residing at his mother's apartment, complying with the Court's bail conditions.
- 3. As of March 17, 2020, COVID-19 has infected at least 182,100 people worldwide,

leading to over 7, 000 deaths.¹ Within the United States there are 4,482 known infections and at least 86 deaths.² As of today there are five known cases in Puerto Rico and 19 suspected cases.³ On March 11, 2o2o, the World Health Organization (WHO) officially classified COVID-19 as a pandemic.⁴ On March 15, 2020, the Governor of Puerto Rico issued an executive order, requiring the closure of all non-essential businesses, imposing a curfew, and limiting travel from the home for specific necessities.⁵

- 4. The confirmed and suspected cases of COVID-19 in Puerto Rico, indicate the possibility of community spread. The highly restrictive Executive Order issued by the Governor is aimed at curtailing such a spread.
- 5. Ms. Rosa is 76 years old. As such, she falls among the population identified as specifically vulnerable to COVID-19 according to the Center for Disease Control (CDC)⁶ and the WHO⁷. Consequently, Ms. Rosa and Mr. Diaz are taking the recommended and mandated measures of social distancing and self-quarantine.

- 6. In light of Chief Judge Gelpi's Miscellaneous Order 20-088 continuing all hearings scheduled before district or magistrate judges due to the outbreak of COVID-19, the defense respectfully requests a continuance of the Preliminary Hearing in this case until the public health emergency has passed or abated. Mr. Diaz seeks to avoid exposing himself, his mother, court staff and employees, the USMS, and the attorneys to unnecessary risk of infection. Postponing Mr. Diaz's Preliminary Hearing complies with the recommendations of the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the World Health Organization (WHO), and the Government of Puerto Rico to practice social distancing to the greatest extent possible at this critical phase of the global pandemic.
- 7. Therefore, Mr. Diaz requests that the Preliminary Hearing be continued until April 18, 2020. The undersigned informs that if anything changes to warrant advancing or further continuing the Preliminary Hearing, the defense will promptly file another motion at that time.

WHEREFORE, it is respectfully requested that this Honorable Court take notice of this motion and that the same be granted.
